

15 ACRES HAS BEEN ACQUIRED IN ASEBU GHANA BY THE DIASPORA

20 Diasporan families from Sankofa Vision Collective (Non-Profit) purchase 15 acres of land in Asebu Ghana!!

SANKOFA VISION COLLECTIVE: Established in 2021 as a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), SVC assists and supports the African Diaspora, with specific emphasis on the Middle Passage's descendants, to acquire affordable homes and land in their ancestral homeland of West Africa. SVC does not purchase land to hold; but provides support to families through educational materials, workshops, networking, and organizing. Presently, we are focused on opportunities in the Central Region of the Republic of Ghana. In this region, the availability of the land is abundant and affordable. While repatriate families may have limited resources, they may obtain economies of scale when working together and pooling their funds together. To this end, the SVC works as an advocate to negotiate for land, building materials, and construction negotiation.

The SVC considers settlement in Ghana a solemn undertaking. SVC comprises West African Diasporan families from all walks of life who desire to repatriate and/or acquire homes in the Republic of Ghana. To this end, SVC is committed to realizing positive outcomes by partnering with other West African Diasporans, who are committed to completing the repatriation process to Ghana. Our goal is to provide our membership the necessary educational tools, resources, and networking opportunities to help them realize their goal to repatriate to the Republic of Ghana. SVC has been working in collaboration with the Obokese Foundation . The Obokese Foundation is a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) that received its Certificates of Incorporation and to Commence Business in January 2020.

The Obokese Foundation is head quartered in the Asebu Traditional Area, adjacent to the Cape-Coast Municipality, under the leadership of Okatakyi Dr. Amanfi VII, Paramount Chief of Asebu

Traditional Area. Nana Obokese Ampah, Apagyahen of Asebu Traditional area of Central Region, Ghana serves as the Chief Executive Officer. In Akan folklore Asebu Ancestors, led by Asebu Amanfi, departed Kemet (Egypt) during the late dynastic period, first settling in Chad before proceeding through Segou—present day Mali—and ultimately establishing the Asebu Traditional Area in Ghana...West Africa. Asebu's dynastic-Ancestral connections are inherent in its Kemetic-based names, cultural songs, rituals, spiritual practices, and symbolism.

The most significant of Asebu's symbols is the 'sacred stone' (obokese, depicited in the logo) upon which King Amanfi sat when addressing the Asebu people (Asebuman). Moreover, the 'obokese' serves as one of Asebus' most significant spiritual mediums, modalities and shrine implements. My official title—Nana Obokese Ampah, Apagyahen—reflects the integration of Asebu's spiritual, cultural, and historical traditions dating back to ancient Kemet. My Chieftaincy Oath bonds me to my obligations, duties and responsibilities (aso dzi) to preserve, maintain and strengthen Asebu's ancient foundations and continually explore ever expanding opportunities, collaborations and vehicles to manifest our Traditional African greatness.

ASEBU, GHANA: Located in the Central Region of Ghana.

Asebu is twenty minutes from the future site of the Wakanda Village which is project led by the African Diaspora Development Institute. It is also the site of the Obekesi University and Hotel and the Pan African Village.
