Asebu, Ghana – December 31, 2024 – The future of community building took a significant step forward today as the Sankofa Vision Alliance LBG (SVA) proudly broke ground on Obokese Sankofa Villas, a groundbreaking initiative designed for the Diasporan community. Nestled in the heart of Central Region, Ghana, this new village will feature a secure residential community with 23 thoughtfully designed home sites, all encircled by a robust 7-foot concrete wall, marking the start of a new chapter for many.

The construction site spans an impressive 15 acres and is already beginning to transform. Notably, one home is currently 90% complete, demonstrating the commitment and dedication of the 10-person construction team led by Arthur Construction LBG of Accra, Ghana. This milestone marks not only the physical development of the village but also a renewed hope for members of the African Diaspora, specifically for descendants of the Middle Passage slave trade.

The Sankofa Vision Alliance, a non-profit organization operating in both the USA and Ghana, is devoted to empowering the African Diaspora by providing essential resources, workshops, advocacy, and networking opportunities. "It is rewarding to see the village begin to come to life," said SVA President Mafo M'bona.
